



KEY STEPS FOR STUDENTS



Apply to be a TEDxYouth@ClaremontSchool Speaker [here](#), before October 18th.



Complete the form and upload your **one-minute video** in English presenting yourself and your idea for the talk.



Meet your TEDxYouth Coordinator, who will help you during the application process.



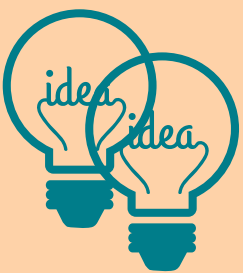
Download and sign the *Parental Permission Form*, *Authorization for Recording and Use of Image Rights*, and *Student Code of Conduct Form*. You can sign them electronically and email them or print them and turn them in to your coordinator.



Once the school has received all the videos and application forms, the school Selection Committee will choose **3 finalist Speakers** who will receive training to prepare for the final audition where **only one** of the three will be chosen to go to Claremont.



PREPARE YOUR TALK



The theme should be centered around topics that interest young people; Our motto is **“YOUNG VOICES, BIG IDEAS”**: You can share a powerful idea, an experience, or a new reflection as a source of knowledge and inspiration for young people around the globe.



It must last **10 mins** maximum, and you are allowed to use photos and images to support your presentation, which will have to be delivered in English.



A **Speaker's Guide** will be provided to help you with your Talk, and during the first stage, the 3 finalist Speakers will receive training and support from their Coordinator to define, prepare and practice their talk.



The finalist Speaker will continue to have the Coordinator's **support and rehearsals** will also be conducted prior to the day of the event.
